Re: Meeting Request to Discuss Comprehensive Government-Wide Strategic Plan on Disability Research

Dear Director Jaeger:

On behalf of the 24 member organizations of the Disability and Rehabilitation Research Coalition (DRRC), we would like to request a meeting with you to discuss the requirement in Title IV of the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act, which included amendments to the Rehabilitation Act, for the Interagency Committee on Disability Research (ICDR) to develop and implement a comprehensive Government-Wide Strategic Plan on disability research. We understand that you, as the Director of the National Institute on Disability, Independent Living, and Rehabilitation Research (NIDILRR), have been appointed as the representative for Secretary Alex M. Azar II to serve as the Director of the ICDR. As such, we seek a meeting solely devoted to this topic at your earliest opportunity which would include other DRRC coalition representatives.

The DRRC is a coalition of national non-profit organizations committed to improving the science of disability, independent living, and rehabilitation. The DRRC seeks to maximize the return on the federal investment in disability, independent living, and rehabilitation research with the goal of improving the ability of Americans with disabilities to live and function as independently as possible. The coalition plays a leadership role in increasing and leveraging federal resources devoted to disability, independent living, and rehabilitation research.

We believe that each federal agency engaged in various aspects of research and development in these areas plays a vital role in the government's efforts to advance the science of rehabilitation, disability, and independent living. We believe the ICDR is the key entity within the federal government that can help maximize return on the federal investment in these areas. This starts with a comprehensive government-wide strategic plan, as established in Title IV of the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act, which included amendments to the Rehabilitation Act. The statutory language details specific requirements for this strategic plan. To date, ICDR has published a background paper on this issue but the next steps are the design, development, publication, and implementation of a government-wide strategic plan.

We view this as an incredible opportunity to coordinate federal research programs in this area across the federal government to improve the lives of people with disabilities and chronic conditions, and are excited to meet with you to discuss ways to advance this issue.
