Dear Senator:

We write to seek your cosponsorship of important legislation, S. 1027, designed to enhance the stature of rehabilitation and disability research at the National Institutes of Health (NIH).

- S. 1027 is bipartisan legislation introduced by Senator Mark Kirk (R-IL) and Senator Tim Johnson (D-SD), two individuals who know first-hand the impact that quality rehabilitation services can have on one's ability to regain health, function independently, prevent further disability, and return to work, following an illness, injury, disability or chronic condition.
- S. 1027 was introduced in 2013 and a series of enhanced provisions have been developed on a consensus basis. These enhancements are attached for your review and are designed to further advance rehabilitation and disability research at NIH. The bill seeks to elevate the stature of rehabilitation science, better coordinate the \$300 million spent annually on this type of research, and deliver the maximum return on the federal investment. As such, the bill is expected to be budget neutral.

With the aging population and a large disability demographic, it is critical to maximize the outcomes of rehabilitation and disability science in order to translate findings into better treatments for this population. We urge you to cosponsor S. 1027 at your earliest opportunity.
