RE: Support for Disability/Rehabilitation Research at NIH/NCMRR in FY 2026

Dear Chairs Moore Capito and Aderholt and Ranking Members Baldwin and DeLauro:

On behalf of the Disability and Rehabilitation Research Coalition (DRRC) and wider disability and rehabilitation research community, the undersigned individuals, organizations and institutions urge you to strongly support full funding for medical rehabilitation and disability-related research at the National Institutes of Health, particularly, the National Center for Medical Rehabilitation Research (NCMRR) within the Eunice Kennedy Shriver National Institute of Child Health and Human Development (NICHD), in the FY 2026 Labor, Health and Human Services, Education, and Related Agencies Appropriations bill.

NCMRR supports approximately \$90 million in rehabilitation science annually and is statutorily designated as the agency within NIH to coordinate over \$900 million in rehabilitation and disability research conducted and supported across many of the NIH's 27 Institutes and Centers. Unlike many other NIH Institutes and Centers, the NCMRR does not receive a direct appropriation from Congress; instead, its funding is allocated as a percentage of the overall budget of NICHD. As such, we do not request a specific funding level for NICHD and NCMRR but urge Congress to fully fund these important research agencies.

NCMRR supports biomedical and engineering research aimed at improving function, rehabilitation outcomes, and quality of life for individuals with disabilities due to injury, illness, or congenital conditions. Its portfolio includes critical work on stroke recovery, spinal cord injury, traumatic brain injury, developmental and neuromuscular disorders, limb loss, and many other disabling conditions. NCMRR also plays a key leadership role within NIH by coordinating rehabilitation science across institutes and fostering innovation in a way that maximizes the return on the federal investment in rehabilitation and disability science.

We also strongly oppose any proposal to impose a 15% cap on indirect costs for federal research grants. Indirect costs are essential for supporting the infrastructure and administrative functions necessary to conduct high-quality research, including facilities, compliance, and data security. Artificially capping these costs would disproportionately impact academic and nonprofit research institutions—particularly those with limited resources—and reduce the capacity of the field to engage in sustained, meaningful scientific inquiry. Such a policy would ultimately weaken the impact and efficiency of federal investment in rehabilitation research.

In addition, we urge NIH to prioritize and implement the NIH Strategic Plan for Disability Health Research FY26-30 under the leadership of the new NIH Director. This strategic framework marks a long-overdue commitment to addressing the comprehensive needs of people with disabilities and embedding disability issues across the NIH research portfolio. The plan outlines actions to enhance data collection, support scientists with disabilities, promote study designs relevant to disability populations, and ensure that the needs of people with disabilities are identified and visible in the nation's health research agenda.

Finally, we urge Congress to fully exercise its role of authorizing and overseeing any reorganization of the 27 NIH Institutes and Centers currently being contemplated by the administration. This should include a deliberative legislative process with robust opportunities for public input, including hearings by relevant committees of jurisdiction.

Thank you for your leadership and for your continued support of policies and programs that advance health, function, and opportunity for people with disabilities. We look forward to continuing to work with you to ensure that medical rehabilitation and disability research remains a national priority in FY 2026 and beyond.
